## First Annual Big Island Film Festival a Hit at Waikoloa Beach Resort 70 Independent Films Screened, *Golden Honu Awards* Presented

WAIKOLOA, HI – As far as first impressions go, Waikoloa Beach Resort and the beautiful Kohala Coast made a big one with the filmmakers and attendees that gathered for the first annual Big Island Film Festival.
